

# Midterm Exam Study List – Spring 2017

- Exam Structure
  - Image identifications (5Qs x 4 points each = 20 points)
  - Short identifications (10 x 3 points each = 30 points)
  - Multiple Choice (20 items x 1 points each = 20 points)
  - Essay (1 of 2 Qs x 30 points = 30 points)
  - Total = 100 points)
- Midterm examination: cumulative (Day 1 through Day 15: see Power Points on Canvas; all 5 homeworks); NOT MUSIC; NOT FLORIDA
  - Opening slide shows and preliminary introduction (Support Pages)
  - Olmecs (art, humanities artifacts, dates, location)
  - Mayas (dates, art, gods, *Popol Vuh*, major rulers, major cities, and pyramids, Tikal, Uxmal, Chichén Itzá)
  - Toltecs (dates, gods, major city, and pyramids: Tula)
  - Aztecs and major allies of Aztecs in Mexico (dates, art, gods, religion, museums, major emperors, major cities and pyramids: Tenochtitlán, Texcoco, Nezahualcóyotl)
  - Incas (dates, art, gods, major emperors, major cities, and ruins: Cuzco, Machu Picchu, Sacsayhuaman)
  - All official terminology and terms from origins to 1600, that is, through Renaissance colonial period (see online Key Terms list in Support Pages)
  - Discoveries and Conquests (Through Day 14): major conquistadors only including texts by Cortés and Bernal Díaz and Las Casas
  - Only these exact dates: 353, 711, 1000, 1025, 1325, 1479, 1492, 1494, 1500, 1513, 1519-21, Dec. 12, 1531, 1532-33
  - Various Latin American people (names, dates or periods, historical and/or humanities artifact achievements) studied through Day 14 including Diego Rivera's murals and one mural by Siqueiros with pre-Columbian content only
  - Major places and especially architecture (pyramids, churches, convents or monasteries) including Acolman, Cuernavaca, Santa Catalina

- Maps (Mexico, Circum-Caribbean, Perú)
- Religions: Mayas, Toltecs, Aztecs, Incas; major gods and rituals; Christianity including Tepeyac, Gualalupe, Juan Diego, Las Casas
